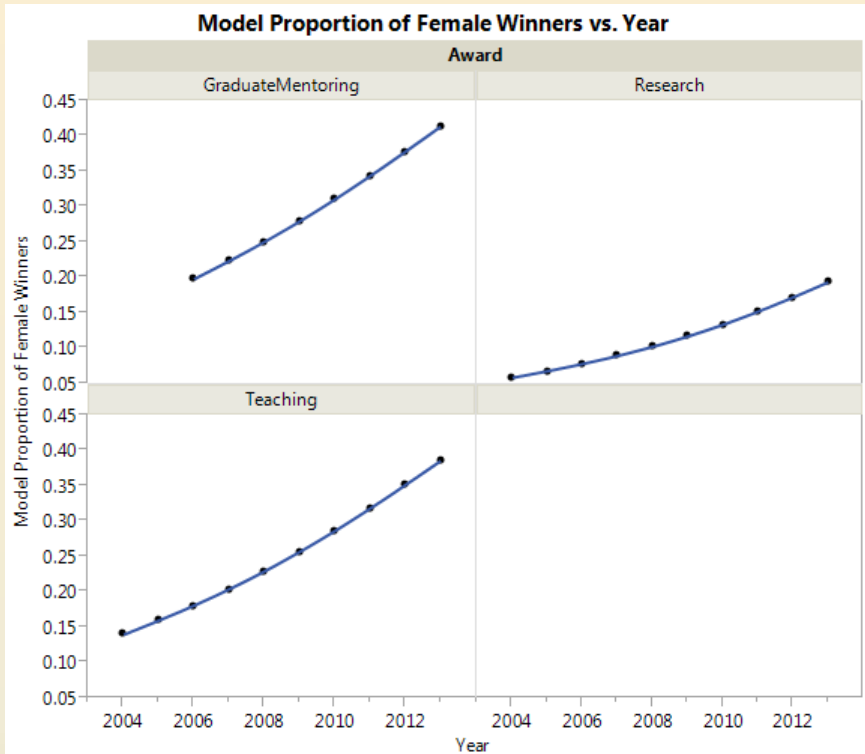
# AFS Award Winners

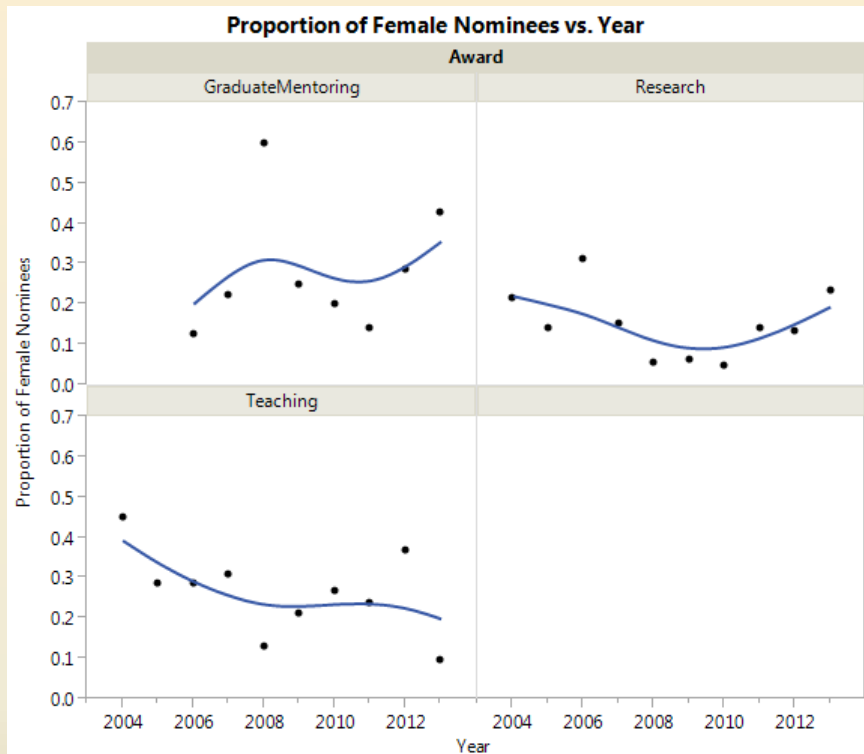

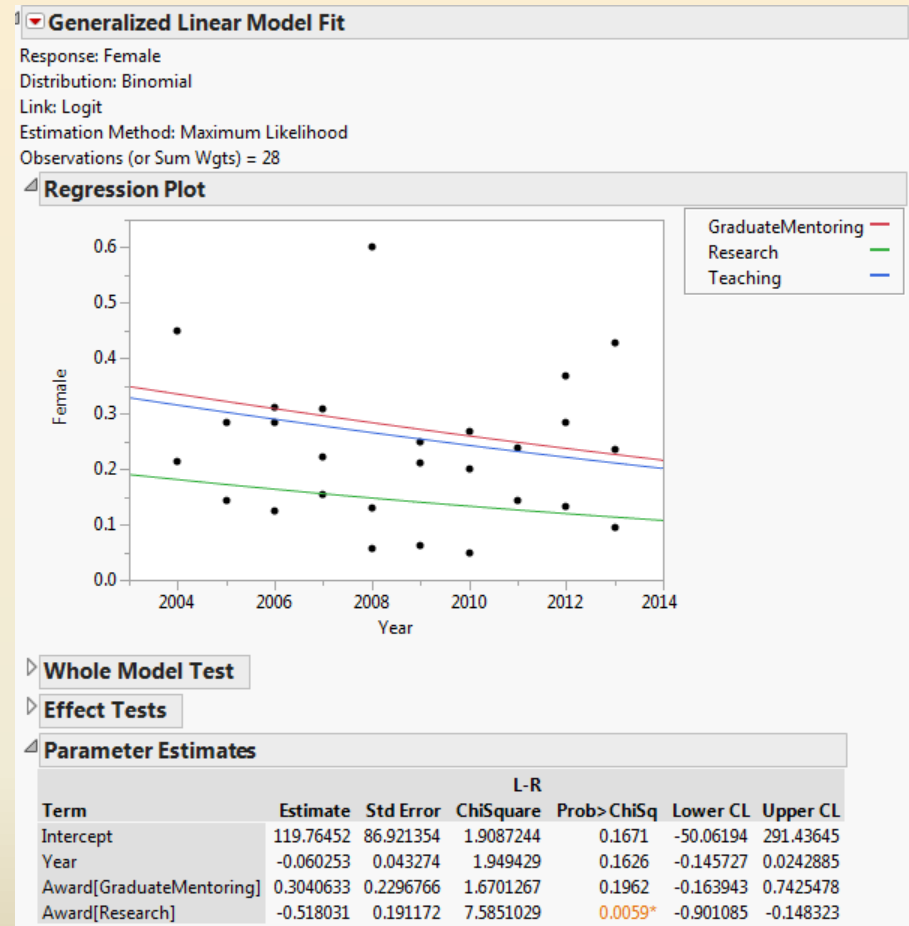
# AFS Award Nominees

*In terms of the proportion of female nominees, there are statistically significant differences*

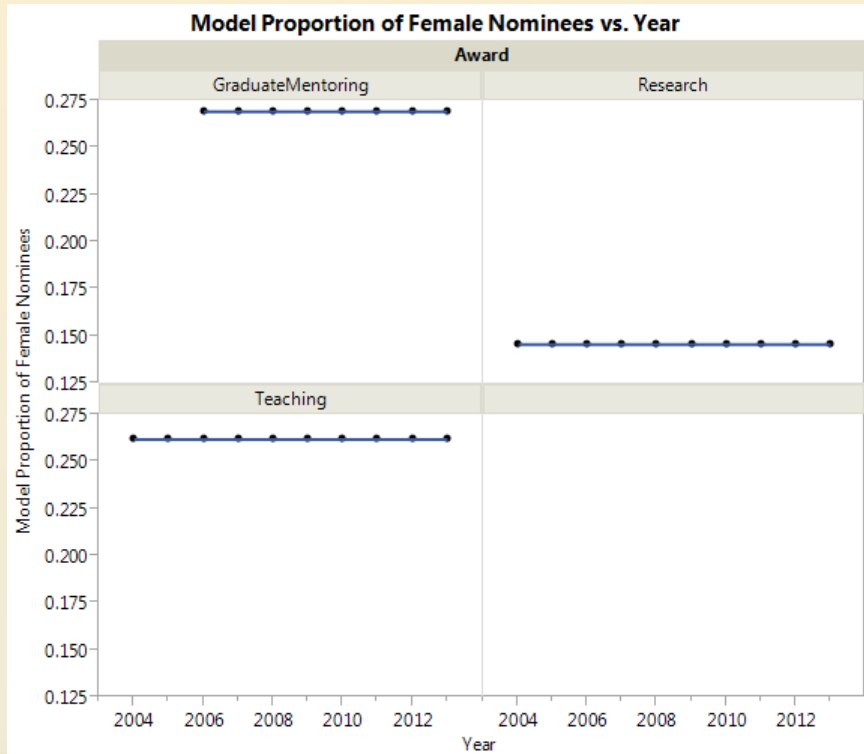
- *between the 3 different awards*
